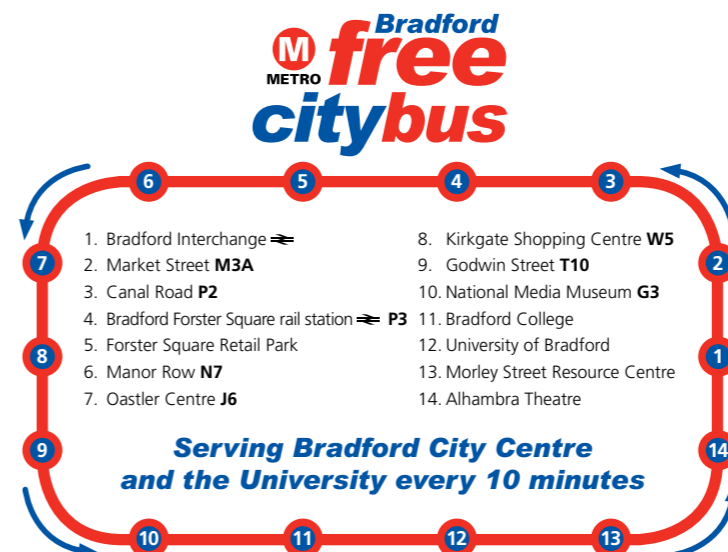
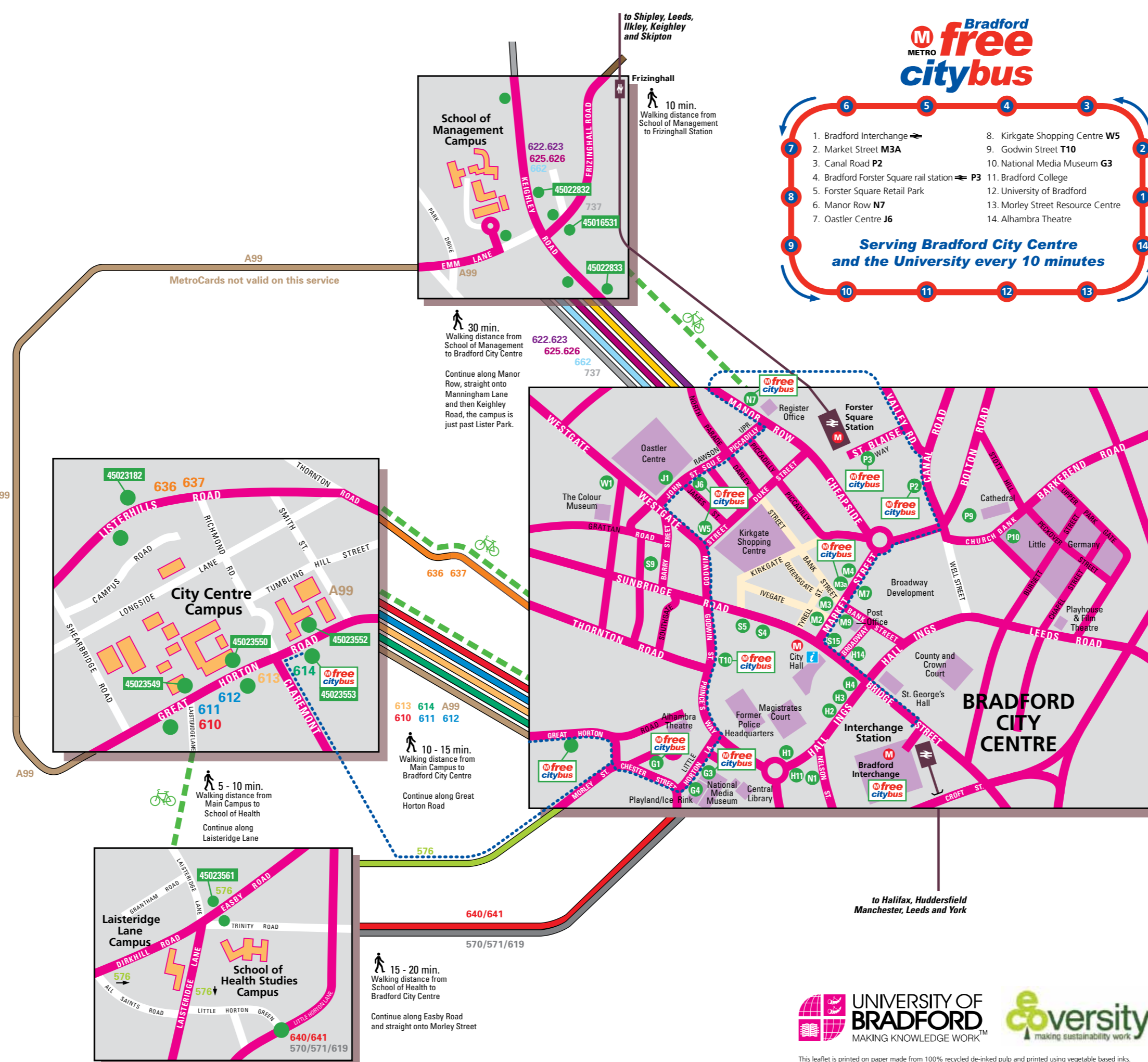

## Travelling to the University of Bradford

### Cycling

We provide a range of facilities including long stay secure cycle lockers and a variety of short stay cycle stands at all our main buildings. In addition, shower and changing facilities are available in a number of buildings. In order to use any of the secure parking on campus please contact security on (01274 23) 4080.

The University also has a cycling support network, the University of Bradford Bicycle Users' Group (UNIBBUG), which aims to promote and encourage cycling. It is free to join UNIBBUG and members can use the Sports Centre Showers free of charge.

### Walking

Walking is great for your health and fitness. It can reduce the risk of heart disease and stroke, improve your cholesterol levels and blood pressure and help you control your weight. Walking will also save you money!



### Walking 1 mile in 20 minutes uses as much energy as:

- Running a mile in 10 minutes
- Cycling for 16 minutes
- Aerobics for 16 minutes
- Weight training for 17 minutes



### To get to the University from the Bradford Interchange

Walking takes between 15 and 20 minutes. Come out of the Interchange onto Bridge Street, over the crossing and continue until you are at the front of City Hall. From here continue walking towards the glass front of the Alhambra Theatre. Turn right immediately before the theatre and walk up Great Horton Road. The University is 300 metres up this hill, beyond the College.

### To get to the University from Bradford Forster Square Station

Walking takes between 15 and 20 minutes. From Forster Square Station, walk out of the station past the sculpture onto Cheapside, then turn right onto Market Street and continue until City Hall. From here continue walking towards the glass front of the Alhambra Theatre. Turn right immediately before the theatre and walk up Great Horton Road. The University is 300 metres up the hill, beyond the College.

### Student Plus MetroCard

Costing just **£17.00** a week or **£62.50** per month, the Student Plus MetroCard provides the holder with virtually unlimited journeys on West Yorkshire's extensive public transport network, which covers Bradford, Leeds, Huddersfield, Halifax and Wakefield.

Metro's Student Plus MetroCard is available to anyone up to the age of 22 and mature students in education for 16 hours or more per week.

The travel card is valid for all travel, at any time of day, on all train journeys within Metro zones 1-5, and on most bus journeys throughout West Yorkshire. Student Plus MetroCards are on sale at staffed bus and rail stations, Metro Travel Centres and West Yorkshire Post Offices.

### Staff Company MetroCard

If you regularly travel to work by public transport or are planning to do so, then apply for a Staff Company MetroCard and save **15%** on the cost. The MetroCard scheme allows you to obtain an annual travel card through the University. The cost of the MetroCard is recovered through equal deductions from your salary/wage over the year. The full range and prices of Staff Company MetroCards are as follows:

### Yournextbus

Metro now offers a real time information service on your next bus. Text your bus stop number to 'METRO' - **63876**. You can find some bus stop numbers on the main map within this guide, all other numbers can be found on the bus stop flags. Texts will cost up to 12p on top of your standard rate.

### UBUS

The UBUS (or safety bus) is a free service for students that runs every weekday during term time, taking students to their front door within a two-mile radius of City Centre Campus. It is funded by the Students' Union with a contribution from Bradford College. Five drivers and five chaperones - a male and female on each service - help to run the bus.

### A99 UniBus Service

The University and First Bradford operate an hourly bus service, Number A99, between our City Centre Campus and the School of Management. The service operates Monday to Friday throughout the academic year.

It is also a standard public service calling at all stops between the two sites. Travelling to the School of Management it runs up Great Horton Road, Horton Grange Road, Ingleby Road, Whetley Lane, Heaton Road and Emm Lane, turning round in front of the School of Management main building and returning the same route.

Journey time is approximately 20 minutes.

### Car Sharing

There are considerable financial savings to be made by signing up for one of the University of Bradford's car share parking spots. These spaces come at a heavily subsidised cost of £60 / year for a reserved space - in return you will need to commit to car sharing on a daily basis. Remember that car sharing is not only good for the environment - saving up to 1 tonne of CO2 a year and reducing congestion - but also for your wallet - saving you about £1000 a year - and is also a nice way of meeting people and making new friends.

### Hire of University Car

Departments can now hire the university car (Skoda Superb) for £20 per day internal recharge; This is only available for business use by staff (not for private use or for use by students); see [www.brad.ac.uk/admin/estates/hirecar.php](http://www.brad.ac.uk/admin/estates/hirecar.php)

### Vehicles

Staff and students can apply for a parking permit, though those living within 2 miles of the University will not be allowed a permit unless there are extenuating circumstances.

### Visitors

Bradford is easily reached by bus, rail, and road.

**BY BUS:** An extensive regional and national bus network connects most parts of the country to Bradford Interchange. National and regional coach and bus information is available from: [www.nationalexpress.com](http://www.nationalexpress.com) and [www.wymetro.com](http://www.wymetro.com)

**BY RAIL:** Bradford Interchange and Bradford Forster Square have extensive rail links. The Interchange is probably where you will arrive. If you have luggage, a taxi costs approximately £3.50 to either the City Centre Campus or School of Health Studies and £5.50 to the School of Management. **BY CAR:** Bradford is connected to the national motorway network via the M62 and M606. When arriving from the South, East or West the best route into Bradford is the M62 and M606. From the Northwest take the A629/A650 via Skipton and Keighley. From the Northeast take the A1 or A19 to reach Bradford via the A59 and then A658 south of Harrogate.

Visitors arriving at the University by car should arrange a parking permit through their contact at the University. If you have been unable to do this please report to one of our three main reception desks - City Centre Campus (Richmond Building), School of Health Studies Campus (Unity Building), School of Management (Heaton Mount) - to obtain a 'visitor' parking permit.
