This is achieved through the examination of the principles of transport management and their application to examples and case studies relating to a range of scenarios in relevant organizations. The approach used is to look at commercial aspects of freight transport management from an operational and strategic point of view.</p>

Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy
<p>Learning will be directed, supported, and reinforced through a combination of lectures and seminars as well as self-directed study.</p> <p>Lectures will focus on the theoretical knowledge and principles of contemporary issues of freight transport in supply chain including freight transport demand, international trade, delivery terms and freight transport, different transport mode, sustainable freight transport and other relevant topics.</p> <p>Seminars will engage students in active learning sessions which draw on and build upon the knowledge base acquired during the lectures to further deepen understanding.</p> <p>Students will be assessed based on an individual report of 2,500 words. This assessment requires students to select a relevant and cotemporary topic with application in the real-word. Formative feedback will be provided (300 words max) to support their summative assignment.</p> <p>Students are expected to demonstrate good effort in exploring the background of the practical problem identified, understanding benefits and challenges around freight transport to write up the report. This coursework will assess against all the learning outcomes specified in this document (LO1, LO2, LO3, and LO4) and will be an excellent opportunity for students to critically evaluate current and emerging issues around freight transport.</p>
