The programme is intended to:

- Leadership for Advanced Practitioners (Core 30 credits)
- Preparing for Primary Research (Core 30 credits)

- Pursuing primary research (Core 60 credits) or
- Pursuing a Systematic review (Core 60 credits) or
- Management Project (Core 60 credits)

POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA ADVANCED PRACTICE (Midwifery)

Students will be eligible to exit with the award of Postgraduate Diploma if they have successfully completed at least 120 credits and achieved the award learning outcomes.

- A wide range of 30 credit modules which you can select from, with the guidance of your tutor and tailor to your needs or
- Prescribing for Healthcare Professionals (optional 40 credits) or
- An alternative HNPP or HMPP module defined by service need (optional 30 credits) and
- Preparing for systematic review (Core 30 credits) or
- Preparing for Primary research (core 30 credits) or
- Leadership for advanced practitioners (Core 30 credits)
